COMMITMENT TO ACCESS AND STUDENT SUCCESS

Students are at the center of all we do. USC attracts some of the most outstanding students from a broad diversity of backgrounds. We are committed to access and affordability as well as an educational experience focused on living, learning, and belonging.

EMPOWERING STUDENT-ATHLETES

We are committed to student-centered athletics encompassing a world-class education, health and well-being, academic advisement, and leadership development.

With **23 men's and women's sports**, USC has an unrivaled Olympic tradition. If the university were its own country, USC's 326 all-time Summer Olympics medals would tie it for **14th among all countries**; USC's 153 gold medals would tie it for **11th**.

- USC's 93% student-athlete graduation rate is 2% higher than the NCAA's rate across all D-1 programs.
- USC student-athletes set an academic record with the **highest** ever cumulative GPA of 3.15.
- USC empowers student-athletes to earn NIL compensation in a manner that is consistent with the NCAA, state law, and its own student-athlete centered culture.
- USC fully funds athletic scholarships and provides Alston awards (\$5,980) for all sports.
- USC operates the largest student-athlete mental health program in the nation with the integrated health care for every student-athlete.



DELIVERING LIFESAVING MEDICAL CARE AND RESEARCH

Keck Medicine of USC is one of only two university-based academic medical systems in the Los Angeles area. USC partners with the County of Los Angeles at LA General Medical Center and with Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA) to provide training, specialty services and medical research. Keck Medicine includes Keck Hospital of USC, USC Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center, USC Arcadia Hospital, USC Verdugo Hills Hospital and more than 100 unique clinics across Southern and Central California, as well as Las Vegas.



- Keck Medical Center of USC is among the top 50 hospitals in the country in 10 specialties. Keck Medical Center is a worldclass tertiary-quaternary care provider, treating the most complex medical cases in the nation.
- Keck School of Medicine is top 10 in the National Institute of Health (NIH) funding in five fields.
- USC and CHLA launched a \$24.5 million NIH funded program to address health disparities in Latino children and families.
- **USC's Street Medicine program** is a national model for providing health care to unhoused individuals, delivering care to nearly 10,000 patient visits a year.



FRONTIERS OF COMPUTING

As a global leader in advanced computing, USC established the new School of Advanced Computing. This is the centerpiece of the **\$1 billion-plus university-wide Frontiers of Computing** initiative for artificial intelligence, machine learning, quantum computing, augmented and virtual reality, robotics, gaming, health care technology and other human-centered technological applications.

USC is committed to community partnerships and building a shared vision with neighbors. This includes educational access, economic and environmental equity, co-designed research, and helping solve the most pressing problems facing society.

- USC's #1 feeder school in the world is LAUSD's Foshay
 Learning Academy, adjacent to our University Park Campus.
- USC serves 3,500 LAUSD students daily through rigorous college preparation programs and local school partnerships including over 400 students currently attending USC tuitionfree.
- **USC operates Head Start neighborhood pre-schools** serving nearly 500 low-income children at eight sites in South Los Angeles and the Eastside.
- The university provides capacity building to **hundreds of local businesses and non-profit organizations**.
- In 2024, launched the new Schaeffer Center for Public Policy
 & Government Service, focused on evidence-based policymaking and educating students on responsible, involved citizenship within a true, functioning democracy.
