Research Spotlight

Sarah Stoycos, PhD

Clinical Psychologist, Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychiatry and the Behavioral Sciences, Co-Investigator on BMS



Dr. Stoycos is a clinical psychologist who specializes in working with clients who have experienced a traumatic injury or burn and are experiencing symptoms of traumatic stress or changes in their mood and functioning.

Dr. Stoycos joined the LA General Burn Center's attending staff 1.5 years ago as our first-ever Burn Unit Psychologist, with the goal of building comprehensive mental health services for hospitalized and outpatient burn patients and their loved ones given the impact of emotional and mental health on physical recovery and community reintegration. Currently, services are still being developed and implemented, working towards universal mental health screening and referral to services for both hospitalized patients and outpatients.

As part of her commitment to improving overall burn care and advocating for increased mental health resources for patients who have experienced burns,

she conducts research examining posttraumatic stress and depression after traumatic injury, is a co-Investigator for our Burn Model System Site, and works with national organizations on several initiatives related to improving research, clinical practice, and access to mental health care for individuals who have experienced a burn injury.

The Wellness Center is a one-stop shop destination for health and wellness. Patients can connect to services and/or participate in healthy activities for FREE.

On November 1st, 2024, we hosted our yearly Movie Night for families to congregate while enjoying the Disney movie, Coco.
